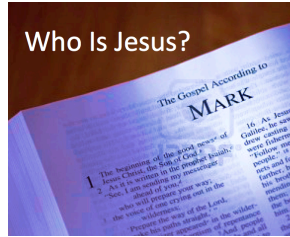

Chapter 6 Notes

Day 20: Jesus rejected in Nazareth, Sends Out Twelve Mark 6:1-13

Blinded to his identity and source of his authority: thought they knew him, an ordinary man, a carpenter, Mary's son, a brother

Took offense: *skandalizomai*: to be caused to stumble, to be repelled; refused to believe that his wisdom and power were from God, thus he did no mighty work there: 1 Pet. 2:6-8

Twelve preach, cast out demons, heal the sick: demonstrate God's Kingdom has come in Jesus: Mark 1:17

Assignment: Read Neh. 9:26; Acts 7:51-60.

Why is it foolish to reject Jesus and his message?

Why should followers of Jesus anticipate rejection?

Day 21: Herod Kills John the Baptist: Mark 6:14-29

Jesus' work becomes known: Is he John the Baptist raised from the dead; Elijah: Mal. 4:5; or a prophet: Deut. 18:15,18?

Herod Antipas conflicted, guilty, worried: Lev. 18:16, 20:21 ·

Clash between kingdom of self and Satan and the Kingdom of God:
Col. 1:13

Assignment: *Read the above verses. Romans 6:23 states: "For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord."*

List the ways Herod was trapped by the sin of himself and others.
