Read Matthew 14:23, Matthew 26:36, Luke 6:12, and Luke 22:41-46. Who is praying in these verses? If it was not only important but necessary for Jesus to pray to God, what should that tell you about you praying?

Read Luke 18:1-8. Why did the judge comply with what the widow asked? What does this tell you about how you should pray? (Hint: be P_____ T)

Read Ephesians 6:16-20. When are we supposed to pray? In what are we supposed to pray?

Read 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 and Colossians 4:2. Again, how are we to pray?

Read Matthew 5:43-48. Who are we to pray for?

Read Psalm 65:1-2 and Psalm 66:16-20. What do these verses tell us about where our prayers go to?

Read Philippians 4:6-7. What are we not to be in “everything”? What are we to do in “everything”? Who are we to make our requests known to?

Read 1 Peter 4:7. Why would it negatively effect our prayers if we are not self-controlled and sober minded?

Read 1 Timothy 4:11-16. What are we to devote ourselves to? Why?

Read 2 Timothy 3:14-17. What is Scripture good for?

We are called to seek the Lord, not just what the Lord can give us or do for us. How are you seeking the Lord today? What ways are you seeking the Lord for what He can do for you? Spend time today in prayer seeking your Father and spending time in His Word.
