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Lesson 86: 2 Samuel 9:1-13 Who Sits at the King's Table?

Read Colossians 3:23-24. In everything that we do, who are we actually working for?

If you truly believed that whole heartedly, what would you do differently?

Would your attitude at work be changed?

Would your attitude toward your children be different? Toward your spouse?

Where is the inheritance to come from?

Is it an earthly one? Is it a material, temporal inheritance?

Read Proverbs 3:27. What are we not to withhold?

Read 2 Thessalonians 3:13 and Galatians 6:9-10. What are we to continue doing?

To whom especially?

Read 1 John 1:11. What are we to imitate?

Read Romans 12:9-21. This passage lists things that are evidence of a true follower of Christ. List at least 13 things here that we ARE to do (not the "do not's").

The last verse sums this all up: what are we to overcome?

What are we to use to overcome that?

Is that from our own characteristics?

Read Romans 12:1-2. How can we know what is good, according to God's will?

How do we renew our minds?

As you spend time with God today, re-read Proverbs 3:27. Consider if there is someone whom you have been withholding good from, for whatever reason. (Example: Not wanting to reward one child for something well deserved because you know the other child will be angry and don't want to deal with the angry child. Yes, I've been there.) Ask God to help you to align yourself with His will. Ask Him to help you to be willing to do good when it is within your power to do good.
