Lesson 100: 2 Samuel 15:1-12 Insurrection

Read Proverbs 27:6. Why would "wounds from a friend" be something you would want?

Why would "kisses from an enemy" be something to avoid?

Read 2 Timothy 4:1-5. What are we to be ready to do, in season and out of season?

A time is coming when people will not want to hear something. What will they not want to hear? What will they seek to hear? Will they stay on the correct path?

What are we to always be?

Read 2 Timothy 3:16-17. What is God's word useful for?

Can you be complete in God without God's Word?

What desire should that impress upon your heart?

Read 1 Thessalonians 5:14-24. Who are these commands written for, those inside the body or those outside the body?

Who are we to admonish? Who are to encourage?

Who are we to help? With what characteristic are we to treat ALL these people? What should our daily lives look like, if we put verses 16-18 to practice? What are we to test? What should we hold on to? What will God do for those whom He calls?

Read Acts 17:10-15. Why were these Berean Jews more noble than the ones in Thessalonica? Did the Bereans simply accept what Paul told them based on the strength of Paul's arguments?

As you spend time with God today, consider whether you would rather have a faithful friend wound you or an enemy kiss you. Consider the relationships you have in your life right now, and ask God to help you to see if there is a relationship that isn't truly a friendship, but is actually harmful to your walk with God. Ask God to prepare you through His word, to be ready, in season and out of season, to reprove, rebuke, and exhort your brothers and sisters in Christ, to follow His footsteps more closely today, and every day.
