Read 2 Peter 3:8-13. Why is it important to understand that time is not measured the same way for our infinite God?

Does this mean that God will not fulfill His promise?

Why, according to this passage, has Christ not returned?

Will the day of Lord still come?

What will it be like?

Knowing that all things will be dissolved, how should we be living?

What are we looking forward to?

Read Matthew 23:27-28. Remember, the Pharisees and scribes were the religious leaders of the day, the ones with all the answers. What does Jesus call these people?

What does He compare them to? What does He say they are full of in verse 28?

Read Matthew 12:33-37. What does Jesus point to as evidence of what goes on in our hearts?

What will we all give account for on the Day of Judgment? Remember, to justify means to "declare righteous."

Look at verse 37. Why is it true that if you declare yourself righteous (justify yourself by your words) that you will be condemned by those words? (Can you justify yourself?)

Read Galatians 2:16. How is a person justified? How is a person not justified?

Read 1 John 1:8-10 again today. Is there sin in us?

What promise can we hold onto when we confess our sins?

As you spend time with God today, praise Him that, even though you *aren't* "good enough", He still sent His Son to die for you! Ask Him to help you to see where you might be falling into the trap the Pharisees fell into, claiming to be righteous when you are not, or condemning others

for their sin while forgetting that you, too, sin and need to be forgiven. We all sin, ladies. Take the time today to see if there is a sin in your life that you are "declaring righteous" (justifying) while condemning others for the same thing. Take that to God and confess it today and receive His forgiveness.
