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Lesson 117: 2 Samuel 22:1-16 Deliverance

Read Genesis 18:9-14. What did the angels tell Abraham would happen?

What was Sarah's response?

What question does the Lord ask in verse 14?

What would be your answer to that question?

Think about that truth in terms of what you are facing in your life today. Is anything too hard for the Lord? (Even if it is too hard for you?)

Read Deuteronomy 10:17-22. How is God described in verses 17-18?

What is our response to be, in light of these qualities? (Verses 19-20)

What evidence/proof are we given of how mighty and awesome our God is? (Verses 21-22)

Read 2 Chronicles 20:5-6. Where does God rule over?

What is excluded from God's rule?

Read Psalm 50:1-2. What happens when God speaks?

How does this reflect His power and might?

Read Isaiah 9:6. What names are given to God here?

What qualities are emphasized in this passage? How might those four qualities all work together?

Read Psalm 33:20-22. Why does David wait for the Lord? (I count 4 reasons).

What does David ask that God keep upon him as he hopes in Him?

Read Psalm 119:113-116. Who does David (the Psalmist) hate?

Where does he go to for his protection?

Where does he go to for hope?

What does David ask God to uphold him according to? Why?

Read Matthew 24:29-31. When Jesus returns again, what promise do the elect have that gives them comfort?

Read Luke 5:29-32. When the Pharisees questioned Jesus about who He spent time with, why did Jesus say He spent time with sinners? What type of a "mission" does that mean Jesus came to accomplish?

Read Acts 4:8-12. Where is eternal salvation found? Is there more than one option?

Read Romans 10:8-13. Fill in the blanks. If you _____ with your _____ that Jesus is Lord and _____ in your _____ that _____ Him from the _____, you will _____. Why is the heart important? What will happen to everyone who calls on the name of the Lord? What type of "saving" is this talking about?
